## Sunrise Service Recipe Egg Bake

Preheat oven to 350°

- 4 lbs. hash browns
- 2-4 lbs. bulk pork sausage, fried & drained or diced ham
- 2 doz. eggs, scrambled
- 1 ½ c. milk
- 16 oz. cheddar cheese, shredded
- Paprika
- Garlic powder
- Pepper

Mix together and place in an 11x17 greased pan. Bake 1 hour and then add another 16 oz. of shredded cheese to top and cook till cheese is melted.

## A Hymn's Long Journey

The beloved hymn "How Great Thou Art" came together across many years and miles. In 1885, when Swedish preacher Carl Boberg wrote a poem titled "O, Great God," he probably never dreamed he'd hear it performed years later to an old Swedish tune. Or that a Russian version would impact Stuart Hine, an English missionary to Poland, several decades later. Hine penned his own English version, resulting in the now-familiar lyrics.

From "the rolling thunder" echoing off the Carpathian Mountains, to the "woods and forest glades" of Romania, to powerful conversions to Christianity, Hine was inspired to craft each verse. Sometimes the Holy Spirit takes time to complete a work, and that journey is as important as the destination.

## Summer Camp





## Luke's Ministry Drooping Eyelids

Pathologic drooping eyelid is also called Ptoisis. This may occur due to trauma, age or various medical disorders.

This condition may affect one eye (unilateral ptosis) or both eyes (bilateral ptosis). It may come and go, or it might be permanent. It can be present at birth called "congenital ptosis" or it can develop in later life called "acquired ptosis." Anyone can get droopy eyelids, but its most common in older adults because of the natural aging process. A tendon attaches the levator muscle, which is responsible for lifting the eyelid. As you age, that muscle can stretch, and as a result, cause the eyelid to fall. Keep in mind though that people of all ages can be affected by this condition. Babies can sometimes be born with it, but it is rare.

Depending on the severity of the problem, drooping eyelids can cause blocking of the pupil of the eye and greatly reduce vision. In most cases, the condition will resolve itself naturally or there may need to be surgical intervention.

These days, most insurance companies pay for surgical intervention if vision is involved. The surgery is minimal and usually same day and is very much worth doing.

## Dan & Elizabeth Turk' Ministry



Serving in partnership with the Church of Jesus Christ in Madagascar Fianganon' I Jesoa Kristy edo Madagasikara (FJKM), Dan and Elizabeth work to

improve the lives of the Malagasy people. Elizabeth trains village health workers, helps communities develop safe drinking water sources and educates church leaders and youth about AIDS prevention. Dan has helped the FJKM develop an extensive fruit tree program that includes a fruit tree nursery and extension work with farmers. He also does environmental education, helping people live in harmony with God's creation. Dan helps pastoral students grow fruits and vegetables. They will use these skills to help their community and families to achieve improved food security and nutrition. The Turks say that meeting needs in Christ's name demonstrates how much God loves them.

### **Providing Technical Follow-up to Recent Seminary Graduates through the Fruit, Vegetable, and Environmental Education (FVEE) Project:**

The technical follow-up helps new pastors further master skills in gardening and fruit growing that they acquired while students in seminary. It helps the new pastors continue their work with gardens and fruit trees in their new churches and communities. The vegetables and fruits also provide food for the pastors and their families who often serve in very poor rural communities. Dan and colleagues have now provided follow-up in three FJKM synods. They provided trees and training for new pastors Haja and Iry and representatives from their nine rural churches. All of Haja and Iry's churches west of Fianarantsoa now have fruit trees and native trees planted in the church courtyards. Pastor Haja grafts avocados and other fruit trees for distribution in his community. Technical follow-up to new pastors is being expanded in 2016. This is part of the FVEE project's role as environmental and agricultural consultants to various structures of the FJKM church.

### **Getting Water to the FJKM Seminary in Fianarantsoa:**

This project was completed with help from PC(USA) churches, the Waterlines Foundation, the Presbyterian Church of the Republic of Korea and the FJKM Development Department water specialists. The water will make life easier for the students and allow them to water their vegetable gardens and fruit trees.

### **Mahatsinjo Communities and School Receive Clean Water:**

This water will help improve health as well as provide water for vegetables and fruit tree production. The elementary school also received showers and an outhouse. The project was supported by the Presbyterian Hunger Program, a PC(USA) grant, The Outreach Foundation, and multiple Presbyterian congregations.

Madagascar is still suffering from extreme poverty and environmental devastation. The majority of the people have difficulty making ends meet. The church's presence is vital to ensure hope and work for a better future. Our partner church, the FJKM, continues to serve and minister to the Malagasy people reminding them of Easter's resurrection message. Our God is a God of hope and new life, more powerful than evil and sin.

Your partnership with us and the FJKM church is making a difference in people's lives. You are helping to bring the Easter message to life in

Madagascar and provide hope to many. Thank you very much for partnering with us. Your continued prayers and financial support will help ensure that we can continue to serve the people of Madagascar that they may know and experience God's love in truth and deed (1 John 3:18).



## MAY SESSION ACTIONS

The Stated Session meeting of First Presbyterian Church, Marshalltown, met in the Lower Lounge Tuesday, May 16, 2017.

Moderator Rev. Ian McMullen opened the Session meeting at 7:12 p.m. and Matt Broshar presented the devotions and opening prayer.

**Motions prevailed** to approve the April 18, 2017 minutes as written.

**Motion prevailed** to approve the baptism of **Pearl Marie Grosvenor** on Sunday, May 21, 2017.

Pastors and staff reports were presented.

**Finances:** Larry Schrum presented the Financial and Investments reports. Giving in April was above budgeted projection. Spending was below the budget. Money from the Building Fund has been used to pay bills for the crossover.

**Mission/Evangelism:** Carter Strand presented the Mission report. Brent Thiessen presented a report on the "Big House," and help is needed to remodel this home. They discussed how church members can be personally involved with this ministry. The committee looked at maps showing where Christians are facing Islamic Extremists in Africa, Asia and S. America.

**Worship & Music:** Mike Gerbo reported that they discussed getting people to call for volunteer jobs on Sunday's when no one signs up to help, and will let the M & I Committee deal with this issue. They discussed starting a calling prayer chain and having prayer teams to pray for special events. Mike asked that any video to be shown on a Sunday be turned into the church office a week ahead of the time they want it shown to help assist the people running the sound board.

"For reasons of order the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper shall be administered by a Teaching Elder or Ruling Elder commissioned to pastoral service when invited by the Session and authorized by the Presbytery." **Motion prevailed** to designate Jon Rottink, an Elder, to preside over the Communion table Sunday, June 4, 2017 in Pastor Rich King's absence.

**Communion**—165 on April 2; 49 on April 13, Maundy Thursday and 195 on May 7. Home Communion was taken to **June Balch, Jean Brennecke, Bonnie Buckwald, LaVone Lee, Rose Muschick and to members at Glenwood Place, Grandview Heights and Hawkeye Care residents.**

**Christian Education:** Nancy VanWyk reported that Graduation Recognition will be May 21. Child Protection Policy Training will be held May 21. Teacher Appreciation Sunday is May 28. The committee continues to plan for VBS using the theme of "Sonrise National Park." Camp scholarship applications are due Sunday, June 4.

**A & P:** Mike Gerbo reported the committee has hired Deb Williams as the Nursery Coordinator. They discussed ways the committee can help the pastors and staff do their usual business when they are called to do ministry as our Spiritual Leaders.

**Membership & Involvement:** Craig Henze reported the I-Cubs baseball game is scheduled for Sunday, June 4. Darrell Meyer will get the tickets. A fishing derby will be held at a later date at Angie Pietig's parent's pond. Craig is working on a time

and date that more people can attend the M & I Committee meetings.

**Property:** Kurt Lynch reported the committee reported they are getting bids to update the church sound system. The work on the church cross-over has started. The stained-glass windows put in the crossover were vandalized and broken, so Kurt's sister is repairing them. Jim Grimmus has ordered a defibrillator for the church which was paid for by an anonymous donor. A list of priorities needs for the church should be made by each committee to give to Property.

**Mission Study Committee:** Pat Kremer reported the survey for the church was emailed to everyone on the prayer request list and many were mailed to people. The Deacons took surveys to their friends to be completed. The completion of surveys is going very well. Session members discussed another one of the questions in the survey.

The meeting was adjourned with small group prayer.


