Is Your Child Ready for School?

1. Make sure your children's vaccinations are up-to-date. Review their record with the physician. Get needed shots before returning to school.
2. Get needed dental work done before school starts.
3. Alert the school about any chronic medical conditions.
4. Assess the child's diet and daily caloric intake. Encourage and provide a daily nutritious breakfast. Trash junk food.
5. Maintain adequate sleep – optimal 8 to 10 hours.
6. Provide a supervised journey to school and home.
7. Make sure your child knows how to contact a parent and emergency care.
8. Children should not speak to strangers or go with anyone else other than their parents.
9. Allow time for recreation/relaxation every day.
10. Have a planned time for accomplishing homework.
11. Enjoy the school year, being with friends and learning new things.

Pastor's Notes

Matthew 14:25-31

Shortly before dawn, Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake. When the disciples saw Him walking on the lake, they were terrified. "It's a ghost," they said, and cried out in fear. But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." "Lord, if it's You," Peter replied, "tell me to come to You on the water." "Come," He said. Then Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came toward Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately, Jesus reached out His hand and caught him. "You of little faith," He said, "why did you doubt?"

Getting out of the boat isn't easy. We expect Jesus to do things that defy our reason and common sense, but we don't want to do it. When fire or wind storms strike your life, it isn't always easy to trust God with the process.

God gives us hope. God's people show compassion. These are signs of the grace of God

in our lives! But we still must listen, put aside our fear and step out of the boat. Like walking on water, following Jesus through this process may seem crazy. It defies our logic and common sense, yet like Peter, we need to be obedient to Jesus. Everything around us will try to distract us from Jesus, like the wind, will try to shift our focus off of Jesus. If we let it, we will fall, but thanks be to God, Jesus will still catch us.

So, let us step out in faith.

AUGUST SESSION ACTIONS

The **Stated Session meeting** of First Presbyterian Church, Marshalltown, met in the Lower Lounge Tuesday, August 21, 2018.

Moderator Rev. Dr. Richard A. King opened the Session meeting at 7:10 p.m., and Matt Broshar presented the devotions and opening prayer.

There wasn't a quorum in attendance, so the meeting was an informational meeting.

Motion prevailed to approve the July 17, 2018 Stated Session Meeting as printed.

Pastors and staff reports were presented.

Finances: Matt Broshar presented the Financial and Investments reports noting that giving in July was pretty consistent with the giving of last month even though July was a five-week month. There is a positive cash flow as spending was below the budget. Some CD's were cashed in and reinvested in three-month Treasury Bills that will make more money in interest. Matt added a new line item in the budget for "tornado relief."

Mission/Evangelism: Matt Broshar reported noting they discussed ways the church can help with the restoration of the church and community following the tornado. The church would be a strategic location to respond with visible response to the disaster by serving daily meals from 5-8 p.m. in Fellowship Hall starting July 22, with Lavonne Watkins coordinating the meals and workers. The church will be open for showers from 5-8 p.m. Volunteers will be needed to assist with the showers. Packaging Corp. of American donated 10,000 flat boxes and placed them on the church parking lot for people to pick up. A Community Event is being planned for Friday, August 31, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. in the church parking lot. Rich King will cook/smoke pork for pulled pork sandwiches and area churches will help with providing salads, pork & beans and desserts for the evening meal. Rich is planning to feed 500 people. A post card will be mailed to people who said they'd be interested in coming.

People will have to park in the city parking lots. Posters are needed to put in other churches and to advertise this event.

Worship & Music: Communion—145 on July 1, and 151 on August 5. Heather Rottink reported that Drew King had made a proposal to purchase a new electronic drum kit for the church. The committee agreed to purchase the drum kit and use memorial money to pay for it. Mike and Joan Gerbo will move to Florida the first week of October. Wynona Anderson will chair the committee for the remainder of the year. Mike will arrange for worship leaders through October and has Communion preparers scheduled through February 2019. The Hymn Sing will continue at 6 p.m. the third Sunday of the month with Garry Rottink leading the programs.

Christian Education: Jon Rottink reported that Ashley Johnson and Amber Young will coordinate a group to take care of “Children’s Church.” A group from the CE Committee cleaned the clutter out of the hallway by the Sunday school rooms. There is new carpet to be installed in the Movie room after the room is painted. A new TV for the Movie Room has been obtained and will need to be hung on the wall. Camp Sunday was August 12, and Sunday school fall Kick-off will be September 9. The three-year Rotation Model was reviewed.

A & P: Doug Butler reported that the committee discussed the church newsletter and how we want to send it out. The committee recommends that each committee assign or get a volunteer leader to facilitate that committee’s work on their assigned Mission Study Committee (MSC) topic. Doug Butler will lead the Communications group. The Session MSC Retreat will be changed from September 29, to November 17. Pat Kremer is calling to get volunteers to help in the nursery. Bobcat Academy staff will be used as a supplement to the church volunteers in the nursery. Motion prevailed to approve the increase in the Nursery Director’s pay to \$10 per hour starting September 1, 2018. The vote on joining the “Fellowship” will be held at the September Session meeting. The Financial Review is ready to be done.

Membership & Involvement: Darrell Meyer reported that tickets are still available for the Iowa Cubs game on Sunday, September 2. Extra tickets will be ordered. The annual Bike Ride to Grimes Farm will be held Sunday, September 16.

Property: Richie Ritter reported that they have reviewed the quotes to replace the Fellowship Hall windows. They discussed the tornado damage and quotes they’ve gotten from different companies to make repairs. They discussed ways the Missions

Committee can use the Gathering Place effectively to bring in groups who want to help with tornado repairs. The carpets need to be cleaned in the Gathering Place. A new picture will be purchased that depicts our mission of feeding the hungry.

Other Business: None.

The meeting was closed with small group prayer.
