Word of Wisdom from Pastor Bryan Kunz

Bright Sadness

After a beautiful spring break week, going back to more wintry weather has been tough. It also got me thinking about the connection between the season of Lent and the spring season. Literally the word "lent" means "lengthen" (as in the days getting longer) or "spring". Of course, it is called this because the season of lent occurs in the spring, as we finally see the long, dark winter coming to an end and the bright, warm days of summer just around the corner.

However, there is also something deeply fitting about connecting Lent with springtime. Spring is a time of growth, likewise Lent is intended to be a time of growth in the lives of Christians. Like this year, spring can also be a mixed bag – warm and cold, new growth springing up but being covered by snow, longer days but gray or storm-cloud-filled skies. This too is fitting to Lent. In the Orthodox church the Lenten feeling is sometimes called "bright sadness."

Bright sadness is the feeling of recognizing the deep depths of our own sin and God's amazing forgiveness. It is the sadness of our distance from God and the brightness of his presence with us. It is living in a broken and hurting world where bridges collapse, wars are raging, young people are dealing with depression and anxiety, and yet choosing to celebrate Easter. In the darkest days of winter, we trust that spring is coming. The dark days of Lent lead us to the brightness of Easter when we declare that Christ has risen and is returning to bring new life, a new creation. Even as we go through sad and hard days, let us never forget the brightness of Easter.

Motion carried to approve the minutes of the February 20, 2024, Stated Session meeting.

Matters of Record: Motion carried to receive Mitch & Michelle Brown and Jacob Jorgensen into the membership and to remove Fran Smith due to her death February 19, 2024.

Search Team Report: The search team has a third interview with a candidate at the church in person with his wife this week.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Bryan noted the Presbytery meeting at the church went well and he appreciated M&I making the meal. He held a new members class on March 10th. He is grateful for Carissa teaching Sunday school and appreciated the excellent class on Sunday.

Finances: Matt Broshar reported year to date giving is ahead of the last three years. Mission grants for the little pantry and United for Ukraine have been received.

Committee Reports:

Property: Steve Anderson said the committee is looking for quotes for the NE door. They have also contacted a company to look at building security. The furnace in the Gathering Place is the oldest one, is not working well, and may need to be replaced.

Christian Education: The Easter Eggstravaganza was small but successful. The youth mission trip has been cancelled for this summer and may be replaced with service to the Marshalltown community.
