The best part of this subscription is that it is available to all of our church members because the church pays for it.

RightNow offers a surprisingly wide range of video studies and lessons on all sorts of topics. They have sections dedicated to individual books of the Bible, topics on the Christian life, themed studies, and a section of kid’s Bible studies and shows. Many of these studies are from renowned Christian leaders and speakers and you can go on

the website and try them out and find something that works for you. If you missed a week of either of our recent classes, you can go back and watch them too.

The price we pay for this service is reasonable, but it really becomes worth it when you all are using it at home as well. These are fantastic resources that are free to you, so I would highly encourage you to check them out. ## Soundboard Bench Update



Over the years, we have added more and more capabilities to the Sanctuary audio/video (AV) system. The most recent addition was the ability to stream services during the pandemic. As a result, the workload has increased to where a single AV technician often cannot participate in worship while operating the equipment.

Last month, the property committee and the Session approved going forward with replacing the soundboard bench. The location of the bench will move forward by one pew, allowing the width of the work area to increase to accommodate two operators. The woodworking for the new bench will be done over several months and installed later this year.

## Volunteer Value

The Do Good Institute at the University of Maryland's School of Public Policy, along with Independent Sector, estimated the national value of



an hour of volunteering at \$29.95 for 2021. They based this on U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics data. It represents an increase of 4.9% over 2020.

The information was released during National Volunteer Week in April to show the valuable contributions volunteers make to their communities. Nationwide, this marks a \$200 billion contribution. It is too soon to tell the full impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on volunteer hours, though 66% of volunteers either decreased the amount of time they contributed or stopped altogether, at least for now.

## National Day of Prayer

May 5, 2022, is National Day of Prayer. Information on the local observance is on page 1. Here are some thoughts about prayer:

Becoming angry is quite easy. The difficult part, as Aristotle observed, is “to be angry with the right person and to the right degree and at the right time and for the right purpose and in the right way.” That, he added, “is not within everybody’s power.”

But with God’s power — and prayer — we can resist the pull of anger. Use these Scripture-inspired words: “Teach us, O God, how to keep our cool when provoked, exercising patience and self-control so we can think wisely and creatively about how to handle stress calmly, after the heat of the moment has passed. Help us choose our associates wisely, avoiding those who are hot-tempered and easily angered. Help us choose your way of handling anger, rather than our own, so we might conquer harmful impulses by doing good. In the name of Christ, who showed us how to use anger for good rather than evil. Amen.”

As summer approaches, you may look forward to a more relaxed routine. But don’t discard all your good habits and commitments! For soul care, try fixed hours of prayer. Simply expand the concept of praying at set times (such as before meals and bed) into praying regularly each morning, midday and evening. Set an alarm on your watch or phone and commit to engaging with God at the specified times. You can do this on your own or with family or friends.

You can pray using Scripture verses, devotional guides, the *Book of Common Prayer* or a resource such as *ExploreFaith.org*. (When I’m tired or overwhelmed, it’s helpful to pray someone else’s words.) You might want to pray the same prayers morning, noon and evening for a week or a month. This practice isn’t meant to replace spontaneous prayers. Instead, use fixed hours of prayer to nurture a consistent habit of conversing with God.



## Learning to Sing: Presbyterian Hymnals and Psalters

The Presbyterian Historical Society has an online exhibit of early church hymnals and psalters. In the early days of the North American church, individual churches sang, or not, based on their own preferences, and there was no "official" hymnal. Many of the psalters contained no music, since the worshippers "sang" them all in the same rhythm or meter.

Some churches used something called a split-leaf psalter, which is a book split across the middle. The music was printed on the top half with the psalms on the bottom. Different tunes could then be sang with different psalms, depending on the desire of the worship leader.

Various Presbyterian denominations in America sanctioned their first hymnals at different times. The first came in 1819, but many congregations continued singing the psalms alone until after the Civil War, with the United Presbyterian Church in North America not publishing a hymnal until 1927.

## Confirmed in the Faith

Confirmation, a rite many churches celebrate each spring, has biblical roots. In Acts 8, Peter and John are sent to lay their hands on new believers and pray for them to receive the Holy Spirit. In the early church, new Christians — usually adult converts — received baptism and confirmation as one ceremony. As more children were brought for baptism, pastors and priests would baptize, but only bishops would “confirm” a baptism, or make it official. Thus, the baptized were granted full membership in the church through confirmation.

Now confirmation allows young people, often after intensive Christian education, to profess for themselves the faith into which they were baptized. Confirmation serves as an important faith milestone, as young adults purposefully embrace a life of discipleship.
