Presbyterian World Mission Closes

As some of you have probably heard, the PC(USA) has recently decided to close Presbyterian World Mission, which was its sending agency for foreign missionaries. In 2010, Presbyterian World Mission supported 200 mission coworkers by 2025 that number was down to 60 and 54 of them were laid off earlier this year.

The reason given for these cuts and for closing the ministry altogether is primarily financial. With the decrease in PC(USA) membership and the closing of churches, this makes some sense. However, the numbers above show that the shift away from missions has been going on for a while. The denomination has struggled with viewing missionaries as colonial and with the ideas underlying evangelism.

I am really bothered by this decision by the denomination. I understand financial issues, but there was no attempt to try other funding methods. I understand that at times missionaries have brought western culture and values more than Christianity. Mistakes of the past do not mean that all foreign missions should be eliminated. I applaud the desire to equip local Christians to do ministry in a country (after all, they know the needs and assets and culture much better). However, the call of Jesus is clear – we are to go and make disciples of *all nations*. The apostles went out from Jerusalem and Judea (their home cultures) and into other areas to proclaim the gospel.

I think the real problem is that many in our denomination have lost the urgency of that command. I suspect many pastors and congregants would question or deny that Jesus is the only way of salvation. When you don't stand on the truth of scripture of course the desire to serve others and evangelize disappears because truth becomes relative and evangelism becomes a bad word.

When Jesus sent his disciples out, he sent them to declare the Kingdom of God and to care for the physical needs of the people around them. Nothing about that call has changed for Christians today. The mission coworkers we supported were doing these same things and equipping others to do them.

I think I can safely speak for our church's Missions and Evangelism Committee when we say that we remain committed to supporting missions work throughout the world and in our own community because it is clear that is what Jesus expects of us.

We connected with the head of Clay County's long-term recovery, who explained much more about the lingering effects of the flooding and the continuing impact on the community. We had worship on the deck at Lakeshore before heading home on Sunday. M&E is looking forward to leading another trip to Spencer sometime this fall.

Our K-5th graders ended their Sunday School year in May learning about the parables of Jesus. They studied the parable of the Good Samaritan and the parable of the Unforgiving Servant. May Session Actions

The Stated Session meeting of First Presbyterian Church, Marshalltown met in the Fellowship Hall, May 20, 2025.

Moderator Rev. Bryan Kunz opened the Session meeting at 7:03 p.m. Lee Wilkinson led devotions and prayer.

There was a quorum in attendance.

Motion carried to approve the minutes of the April 15, 2025, Stated Session meeting.

Lead Pastor's Report: Pastor Bryan reported his trip to Egypt went well. He will be gone the last week of June on study leave. There will be no adult Sunday school in June and a series on evangelism will start in July. A sermon series on 1 & 2 Thessalonians will begin in June.

Associate Pastor's Report:

Pastor LaCosta shared that the Spencer mission trip went well and they are hoping to have a group go again in the fall. She will be gone June 4-10 presenting and preaching at RCA General Synod, and also June 15-21 leading the youth mission trip to South Dakota. Youth group finished the year well.

Following questions at last month's meeting, Pastor LaCosta lead a discussion about transgender people. The session affirmed our desire to lovingly welcome and disciple all who come through our doors. **Finances:** Pastor Bryan reported (with help from notes Matt Broshar left for him) that April weekly giving exceeded the target. Spending for the third floor project is also reflected in the report.

Committee Reports:

Administration & Personnel:

The 2022 financial review report was presented showing no concerns. They are reviewing policies and procedures with the goal of presenting them to Session for approval next month.

Property: Steve Anderson reported they have someone to replace the heaved concrete at the entrance and some broken places on the north side of the church. Carpet will be installed on the third floor next week. Mission/Evangelism: Lee Wilkinson reported PCUSA has ended its world mission program abruptly at the end of March. Pastors Bryan and LaCosta are working to gather information on this upsetting action. Motion to pause mission giving to PCUSA until we have more information about where our money is going carried. The committee will be discussing this further. Worship & Music: There were 100 for communion in May.

Christian Education: Pastor LaCosta said people are needed to lead stations for VBS July 14-17.


Membership & Involvement: Tracy Ostrem said the committee did not meet after a very busy April.
